Submissions may include empirical studies, theoretical analyses, literature reviews and book reviews.

In relation to literature reviews and meta-analyses, we enthusiastically invite papers that encompass examination of research written in languages of the BRICS countries.

We particularly encourage interdisciplinary and comparative approaches that shed light on the complexities and nuances of educational practices and reforms across the BRICS nations.

Papers focusing on comparative research within the education systems of several of the long list of BRICS countries are of interest.

Submissions should demonstrate methodological rigour, strong empirical data, relevance to the broader discourse on education, and knowledge in the BRICS context.



Submission Guidelines

Manuscripts should be written in English; however, in addition to the English version, we have the capability to publish several versions of the paper translated into the different languages of the BRICS countries (the journal does not provide translation service).
